## **Post Death Story**

<u>Western Union Death Notice</u> - 10/11/45: War Department sends death notice to Edward's family.

<u>Death Mass Notice</u> - 12/2/45: Notice in local newspaper of a Mass for both Edward and Leonard at St. Joseph's Catholic Church, Mt. Oliver, Pittsburgh.

<u>Death Notice Correction</u> - 12/12/45: War Department sends corrected copy of Edward's death notice to family.

<u>Correspondence</u> - 6/8/48 to 6/11/48: Letters between the Dept. of the Army and the Lippert family concerning the return of the remains of the bodies, interned overseas since Nov 1944 for Leonard, back to the U.S. for burial. Again, Edward's body was not recovered after his crash.

<u>Death of Father</u> - 8/7/48: Burial of Edward's father, Edward L. Lippert at St. Joseph's Cemetery in Mt. Oliver, Pittsburgh ... now named St. John Vianney.

<u>Burial Mass for Brothers</u> - 9/11/48: Notice in local paper about a funeral Mass for Edward and his brother, Leonard, at St. Joseph's Cemetery

<u>Randall Colvin Letter</u> - 11/5/95: Letter from Randall Colvin sent to Norb Lippert (now age 56).

Monsignor Glavin Letter - 2/11/96: Letter from Monsignor Edward Glavin, chaplain for the 475th in Burma, sent to Norb Lippert (now age 57).
