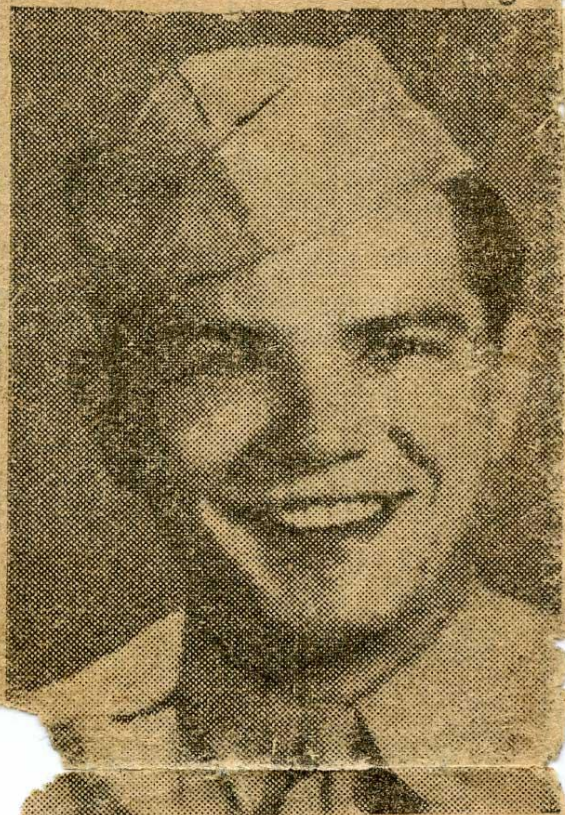


Military Mass to be Sung, Dec. 2nd For Edward and Leonard Lippert

A military solemn high memorial mass will be sung in St. Joseph's Church, Mt. Oliver, at 11:00 a. m. Sunday, December 2 for Sgt. Edward S. Lippert and Pfc. Leonard J. Lippert, sons of Mr. and Mrs. Edward L. Lippert, of 142 Rochelle Street, both of whom were killed during World War II.

Sgt. Lippert, 22, who was born in Mt. Oliver, was killed in an Air Transport crash into a mountain top 20 miles from Chinkiang, China, on September 28, of this year. He had been in the Army more than three years and was a member of the Mars Task Force and served in the China-

Burma-India Theater of war and was also a member of Merrill's Raiders. He was wounded two times.

His brother, Pfc. Leonard J. Lippert, 20, was killed November 19, 1944, while serving with the 30th Division, Ninth Army at Kinsweiler, Germany.

Both attended St. Joseph's School in Mt. Oliver, and worked at Woolworth 5 and 10 cent store.

In addition to their parents, Edward L. and Marie A. Lippert, they are survived by a sister, Mrs. Dorothy Koppitz and two brothers, Norbert K. and Dale J. Lippert.
